financing your church building repairs, renovations and retrofits

Our local church buildings – our congregational homes – support many dimensions of the work of God and God's church. They are an important resource in our mission endeavours.

Over time, roofs, furnaces and parking lot surfaces routinely wear out and this necessitates intentional planning and investment. Attending to such repairs is important and requires both time and financial planning.

Responding to new ministry opportunities sometimes involves the remodeling of a church building. A congregation may embark on a renovation in order to adapt space for greater hospitality, to prepare it for a mission project within the community, or to accommodate a new expanding church group. The scope of this work can be as broad as a congregation's vision – from moving a wall to building a whole new addition.

Stewards of public space

Congregations are always seeking ways to be more responsible, relevant, open, and inviting. This search, together with profound changes taking place in our society, challenges congregations to understand their role as stewards of public space. So, in addition to repairs and renovations, congregations must plan for self-determined or government mandated building retrofits – for health and safety, for accessibility, and to incorporate environmental upgrades.


Financing Your Project
