. . . This year's HOLIDAY CAMP for ADULT YOUNG PEOPLE will be limited to 125 Campers. . . The daily programs are planned out of the experience of the campers themselves -- and are flexible enough to meet the day-to-day

. . . "HOLIDAY CAMP" was organized for the large group who had "outgrown" the Young People's Union age, or who did not take an active part in Church youth groups. . . It has also proven to be attractive to young people who attend "LEADERSHIP CAMP" for local and presbytery officers in Y.P. Unions --- (held at Sparrow Lake from Saturday, July 26th to Saturday, August 2nd) ---

DESIGNED as a delightful discovery of how a group of 125 young adults can live together for nine-days as "one happy family", HOLIDAY CAMP provides adequate recreational facilities for all. . . The concrete Tennis Court claims its devotees from dawn to dusk. . . Badminton, ping-pong, shuffleboard and group games are adequately arranged in the new Recreation Hall --- while the Volleyball Court, Horseshoe Pitch and Sports Field give ample scope for other outdoor recreation. . .

. . . The broad Sandy Beach is a great attraction, morning and afternoons, whether for getting a sun-tan or for gaily enjoying a refreshing swim with a happy crowd of campers. . .



. . . Still others like to lazily relax with a good book under the trees, or to enjoy the "recorded hour of symphonic music" in the Grove, while still other campers find real delight in hiking around the Camp's 250 acres, or wandering off to other portions of the rugged countryside on nature-lore exploratory trips. . .



. . . Then, when evening falls, the campers vie with each other in taking part in stunt programs, play parties, recreational nights, and other night-time programs. . .

On one day at Camp there will be an All-Day Cruise, in two chartered launches, all the way down the Severn River to Georgian Bay, leaving Camp right after breakfast and returning in time for supper. Some 57 campers find this to be a fascinating outing, with a picnic lunch on an island in the famous Gloucester Pool. . .

. . . Spiritual enrichment is gained through the morning meditations, the campfire or evening vespers, and the informal conversation of cabinmates or around a campfire late at night.
